You may find it helpful to use this outline to help prepare your responses and save time by cutting/pasting from word to the online form. All applications must be submitted through the Foundation's website to be considered.

Applications are reviewed in the order they are received. The Foundation Board meets ten (10) times per year and will review up to thirty-five (35) applications per meeting.

Please be sure that all uploads are in PDF form and are legible when printed on standard, portrait oriented, letter-size paper. Also, please make sure your organization name and file name appear in a footer on each uploaded document.

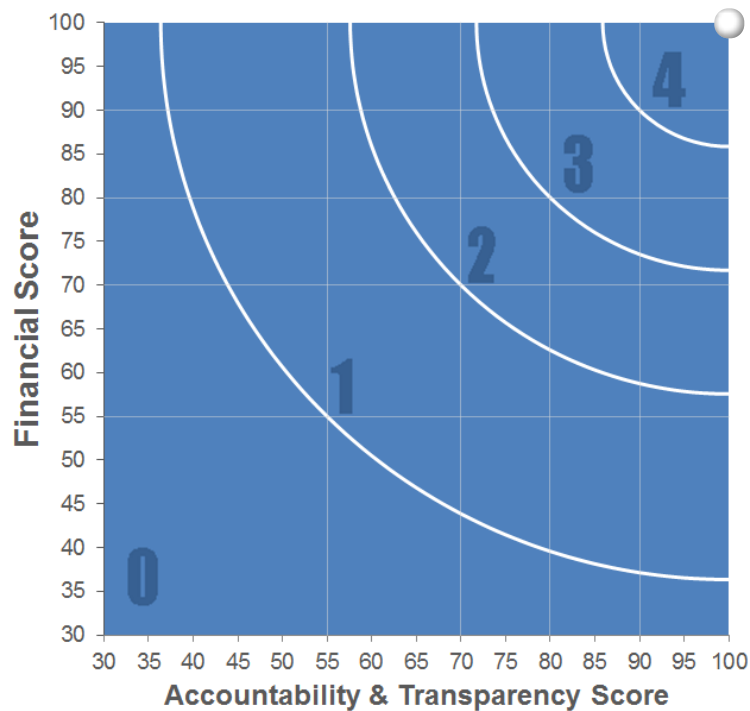

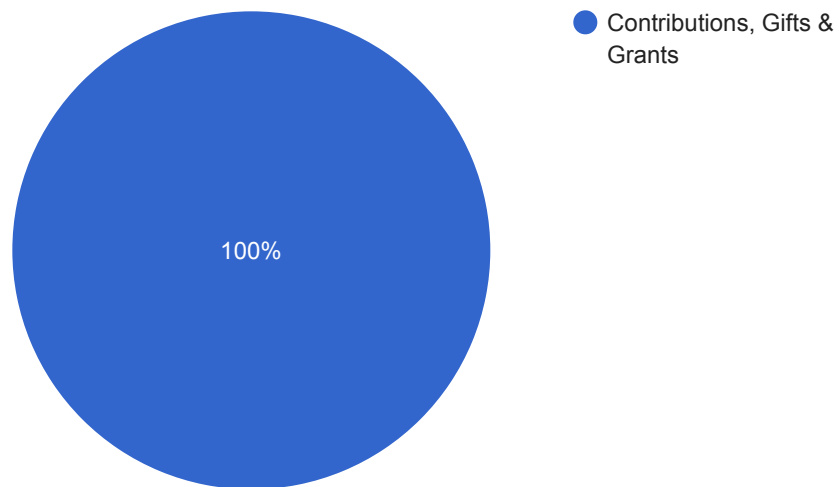

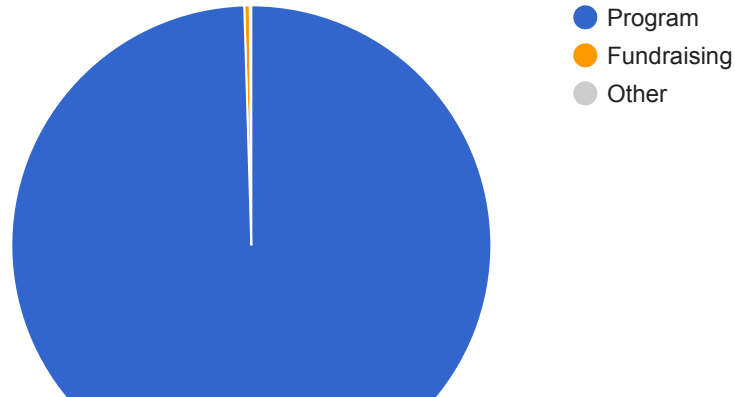

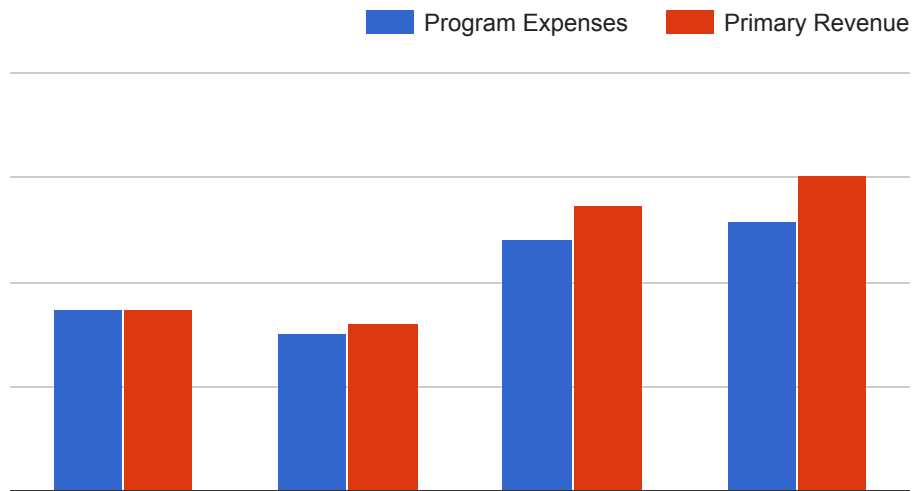
Contributions Breakdown (FYE 09/2016)
